

Students' Health and Safety Guidelines for GASA Schools:

Parents are not allowed inside schools, if late, the teacher or principal should be contacted for meeting the student at the door.

After Students' Drop-Off:

- All students will meet outside and go inside together as a class with their teacher.
- Masks have to be worn the whole school day. Please send your child with a medical grade mask to school.
- Hands need to be sanitized before entering the classroom.
- Hands need to be washed before and after recess.
- All classrooms will have disinfectants available.

Daily Health Check:

Upon drop-off, parents will be asked if anyone in their household has been ill. All students have a temperature check before entering school. If a student's temperature is above 100 degrees, he/she will not be allowed to attend school that day. Children should be fever free without medication for 24 hours prior to returning to GASA.

- If a case of COVID-19 arises, the staff or student with COVID-19 will need to be isolated.

The ill student or staff member can return to school and end isolation once the following are met:

- 10 days out from the start of the symptoms, AND
- Fever free for 24 hours without fever reducing medication, AND
- Symptoms have improved

- Physical Distancing: Staff members will be wearing face masks at all times and the students will be placed at least 3 feet apart or more. Windows may be opened to provide more air circulation and ventilation. For now, we will have recess outside and eat outside.
- Sanitizing and Disinfecting: To keep everyone as safe as possible, we will intensify our efforts to keep our facility disinfected. Staff will increase their frequency of cleaning surfaces and classroom materials.
- Hand Washing: Children and staff will wash hands more frequently throughout the day to reduce the transmission of germs. Hand washing is still the #1 way of combating illness. Proper handwashing will be reinforced on site and will be monitored closely by staff. Hand sanitizer stations will be set up throughout all classrooms for the /children to use.

We are committed to protecting the health of our students, staff, and families by taking the everyday preventative measures listed above, however, it is also important for families to monitor their own health for any symptoms. It is also very important to follow our program's new guidelines and we ask that you notify us immediately should your child, or someone in your household become ill with COVID 19. We will follow the CDC guidelines diligently to stop the spread of COVID-19 and their website will be monitored closely for any new guidelines and precautions.
